Online interviews fielded May 9-June 3, 2024
Margin of error +/- 2.5

For this survey, 1,527 West Jordan City residents were sampled from a city utilities list and supplemented with both voter file and USPS contacts. Survey invitations were sent via email and text message. Survey interviews were completed online. The data were weighted to reflect the demographics of registered voters in West Jordan City, specifically in regard to age, gender, home ownership, race, and city council district.

As an Utah native West Jordan was always viewed as one of the nicer places to live growing up. When I had the opportunity to move my family to the area [REDACTED] I quickly jumped on it. In that time I've seen the quality of life decline. Increased traffic, poor road conditions, severely congested neighborhood streets and no attempt to remedy them. All the while more and larger apartment complexes are built, more single family residences are bought by investors who turn them into rentals or are used to house multiple families. The latter of which leads to vehicles cluttering properties and streets, preventing something as simple as snow removal from occurring or mail being delivered. Coupled with the lack of enforcement of city code has essentially started to turn West Jordan into an area that people are leaving.

Build build build with no thought of infrastructure! Roads, schools, utilities, etc. Traffic sucks and it seems they're doing nothing to offset it.

City Council members seem like clowns and communication with the citizens is poor

City and property tax is out of control TAX TAX TAX Is the West Jordan way

City boundaries are way to large and newer West Jordan gets way more attention than Eastern West Jordan

City planners (and the Mayor?) seem to be more concerned with tax revenue than with planning communities in an effective way that will benefit the city long-term. If I am paying property taxes for something, I should be able to take advantage of that offering without additional cost to me as a resident. The roads in Oquirrh Shadows are failing and have large potholes (specifically Wake Robin Rd), which has been evident for years yet other areas receive the road repairs. And probably worst is the continued crime involving theft and vandalism/graffiti - increased patrols through the neighborhoods would be nice.

West Jordan is an embarrassment and needs at minimum some beautification.

West Jordan city office

1. West Jordan seems to tear up 7000 south every year at least twice. Seems incompetent and expensive.
 2. The police are wonderful here'. They respond quickly, are helpful and knowledgeable
 3. People soliciting door to door need to be stopped. Many ignore my signs, don't have a clearance from city, and it's too rampant.
-
- 2-1/2 year waiting list to have sidewalks repaired is ridiculous. I tripped on uneven sidewalk and had to have stitches. Reply from City was when we get around to it.
-
- A City workers seem a little overworked.
-
- A house in our neighborhood was recently changed ownership and the new owner did a lot of work on the house without getting the proper permits in preparation to rent the house. I contacted the city and the response was prompt. I do have a concern that they will rent the house in violation of the city code but will find it acceptable to just pay the fines and write them off as a business expense.
-
- All the cable construction is horrid. Yards being ripped up and the repairs are less than stellar. I called the city and was told it wasn't them. Then I find out Wj contracted if. I felt betrayed. Like the city lied to me. I think a city official should come inspect the work these "contracted" companies are doing to repair the issues after they are done with their projects. More like quality control to keep WJ at a better standard than other cities.
-
- As mentioned before, the Mayor and his office are extremely responsive and I feel how much they care for our city. I have also appreciated the folk working on the traffic master plan. Their ZOOM presentation was extra well thought out and very easy to understand. They had many ways to reach out to them with additional customer service. Good job.
-
- As someone who owns agricultural property here, and livestock, it is disheartening to see all of the apartments and rental properties going up. Renters do not help with property taxes, and those have increased ever year. We would like to see a greater focus put on maintaining what is already here, instead of expanding with apartments and other rentals properties
-
- Attempted to reach out to the cult planning Dept about a contradictory Street restriping, but got dismissed, felt like the engineer was offended that I would reject his plan, and he simply threw his behind code interpretation, Rather than trying to find a solution, very poor behavior, and disappointing.
-
- Attitude Code enforcement personnel who I talked to was condescending, made excuses for why they probably couldn't do anything(if we can't see it from the street or the problem is worse outside of normal weekday hours, there's nothing we can do). When I offered to send photos of egregious violations, he agreed those would be useful but no action was taken. Problem persists and home owner is trying to acquire more land nearby to increase storage and parking of large vehicles in a residential area, plus have multiple families renting in one home.

- Better response time

- Building and planning services have been super professional, helpful and cordial.
-
- Called about speeding in our neighborhood nothing done yet, We requested speed bumps and signs nothing yet
-
- Called for moving services and then stopping services at previous home and having to change that date. Very helpful, kind and did the change I needed
-
- Called in to ask about scheduling a dumpster. The scheduling function on the website was being re-done so the office told me to set up my account on the website first & then call back to schedule the dumpster. She told me all the steps required very clearly, was so helpful & cheerful on the phone. I called back after setting up my account & she had the dumpster reservation set up very quick.
-
- Century link mess at my house.. emailed the mayor, he sent our wj employees but I wasn't home. Never heard back. Very disappointed century link had permission to destroy our neighborhood.
-
- City hall didn't need to be renovated. Renovation took too long. Also, Arts Council is dishonest and only in it to make money. Long story Code Compliance has been AMAZING with neighbors that don't follow rules/policies/laws. They don't get enough recognition for the thankless job they do.
-
- Code enforcement West Jordan needs to have residence clean up their yards. Some of these neighborhoods are a total embarrassment.



Code enforcement doesn't seem to enforce much.

Code enforcement is a joke. The employee lied and misrepresented my property and made threats against me that were way in excess of reasonable. I contacted the mayor and he was somewhat helpful and agreed with me but spent a lot of time defending bad employees. It would be better if the effort was more focused on working positively with residents rather than just throwing stuff against a wall and seeing what sticks.

Code enforcement is doing a great job!

Code enforcement staff is ver friendly and courteous

Code enforcement visited my home, left a letter on my door concerning having recreational vehicles on my property. It took several weeks of trying to get someone to return my calls or emails. When I was finally able to reach someone I was told I had vehicles that needed to be in 6in of gravel and then received a summons for court. I attended the hearing and my connection dropped since it was over zoom, judged ruled in the city's favor and cannot be appealed. I have since removed the vehicles the city deemed inappropriate, requested a revisit from code enforcement and was told it would be a fee a \$150. This could of been avoided if code enforcement would of came when we were home instead of leaving a notice on the door and at the least returned a call or email so the situation could of been explained an avoid additional cost and time to the home owner.

Code enforcement wasn't helpful. Businesses take advantages of it.

Contact with the city has been very positive, but I haven't heard an update on my request for a cross walk to be reviewed. Our neighborhood crosses 1300 W frequently and there is not a crosswalk near by (our neighbourhood is completely enclosed) so that we can access the Jordan River trail.

Contacted Public Works about an extra trash can I had ordered. The lady I spoke with was very professional and pleasant. My problem was resolved by the end of business the same day. I was very pleased.

Contacted Stormwater Management to inquire about a covered storm drain outlet that dumps into a uncovered storm drain ditch in my back yard, that flows into a covered inlet at the property line. I wanted to know the best way to go about making it a covered pipe the whole way through the section that runs through my property as it leaves quite a bit of trash when running through my yard.

I spoke on the phone to a Engineering Development Coordinator who had me email them so they could pass it along to Stormwater Management. She responded to my email saying that she passed it along and was waiting to hear back. I followed up via email 3/4 times over the course of the next 4 months and never got a response back from anyone.

Contacted non-emergency at night about a dog barking in the rain and cold. Person was polite but I'm not sure if anything was actually done.

Could do follow up emails

Definitely didn't want to go above and beyond...just basic answers to questions that were important to me

Did not contact office directly.

Don't remember names, but it was for an abandoned neighbor house.

Dumpster service has been made completed

During a huge snowstorm our circle didn't get plowed for a couple days, including the garbage pick up. Called to inform them. I don't know her name but she was extremely polite, apologetic and explained the order of business for the plows/garbage people. She sent them back out the same day to pick up our garbage and the circle got plowed shortly thereafter. Was so thankful for the service provided and professionalism

During different situations, one police office was super respectful, kind and empathetic to the situation. Two other occurrences the officer was arrogant, condescending and got his rocks off being in charge. It wasn't worth it to bring the occurrence to the attention of the chief, but those difficult officers make the job harder for the good ones.

Echo Ridge meeting with apartment complex going in by Amazon. WJ representative said we as home owners are lucky we have been invited to the meeting. We are treated as a problem neighborhood. We got put in an industrial area. No access to cross walks or Ron wood park. We don't have a voice even with the hoa advocating.

The apartment complex is putting in a park and parking lot right into our neighborhood instead of the wells park road. We asked the city



to block through traffic and put up a barrier if they need access. They won't. The city planning won't listen to the residents.

The city does nothing with the apartment that has it residents park on the street. City code says no parking in winter months. It blocks traffic and is not safe. Broken down cars and more are out on the street. [REDACTED]

The dance studio traffic blocks the road getting into our neighborhood. The city doesn't care. Nothing changes.

Just buy us out of our houses and put in industrial! Not homes or apartments!

Employees are generally nice but problems are never resolved when I contact the city.

Employees need to be taught to use manners and be polite. I understand that sometimes people are having a bad day, but they can still be polite on the phone.

Enforce the fireworks bans. Tired of fires starting near my neighborhood

Everything is fine.

For the first time since living in West Jordan we had to call for police assistance by 911. This was in response to a road rage incident that happened to us, the person brandished a gun at us, we called 911. We told the dispatcher we had the full incident on our dash camera, gave a very good description of the individual. The 911 operator hung up with me and said an officer was going to call me right then, we never received a call and no follow-up at all. This was a very scary incident as we were so close to our home and there was a group of motorcycles and trucks together trying to surround us, we luckily were able to turn around and speed away through several neighborhoods losing them. I was very disappointed in the response from West Jordan Police by them not following up on a road rage incident with some pulling a gun out during it.

Garbage collection is poor at best. Green waste pickup is hit and miss and I am constantly having to contact the city about missed pickups.

Get rid of the high paid politicians, judges, and school officials

Feed the kids with that money and stop taxing the residents

Getting replacements for garbage bins is very efficient.

Good Police & Fire Departments. Good Public Utilities. Grateful that we have a deal with Google Fiber. My Internet access is very limited where I am at.

Had to contact non emergency line, and they were quick to answer the phone and answered my questions professionally.

Hard to navigate the website need more quick links

Has a problem with my water.

Paid for a plumber. Ended up being the city's fault.

Had another problem. City did a terrible job fixing my park strip.

Thankfully century link screwed it up even worse and fixed it.

But I would still like the city to pay my plumbing bill of \$300

Have requested speed limit enforced but seems not happen.

Have a meeting, change the rules, start issuing warnings, then cite and ticket irresponsible animal owners. Make them pay a fine and send them to proper animal training classes. This is the number one problem we have within our own neighborhood and visitors can't believe how bad the situation is.

Have a problem with weeds and access on the street to my home because of the amount of cars on both sides of the narrow road. The weeds still exist and the parking on both sides of the road is continually making dangerous to navigate. Children can not be seen and it's time narrow to drive safely.

I actually contacted SLCO to inquire about Tax relief information. I left synopsis of reasons for calling and my contact information and was never contacted.

I am disappointed with the department over the cemetery. During the winter season, there isn't a need to maintain the grass and such, yet they cleared off all the graves on January 2nd. When one employee was asked why when some people don't finish celebrating Christmas until January 6th (Advent Day) he said they were allowed to clear things after any federal holiday and that it doesn't matter what the beliefs are of any of the families. As one who spent a lot on a lantern and candle that would have stayed until January 7th and it



is now in the trash because of this belief, I am very upset and would like the beliefs and feelings of families to be taken into consideration, not just having something neat and tidy because you can't stand clutter.

I am glad to be here.

I appreciate the balance achieved by the city regarding vigilance to all things that could become bad (overdevelopment etc) and the good things that come from living here

I asked a person running for council. West Jordan is becoming a big city and yet they don't feel the need for a liquor store. Every city has at least one.. I was given my questions "we don't feel a need". Do you know how much city tax revenue the city would make with liquor sales. So they put one across the street from West Jordan and that city collects the tax revenue

I believe we need more community action support services and more upstream crime prevention services (educational opportunities, drug prevention programs). Just this morning (May 9th) I found an open suboxone packet on my morning walk - which doesn't make me feel unsafe, but I want to be sure that members of my community are getting the services they need to be productive members of the community.

I called for water leak in the street and came out and did excellent job repairing the problem also called code enforcement on the problem and responded in a timely manner

I called several times to get back on equal pay with water and was told it was and made sure 2 other times in October and then called because it wasn't and the lady said why don't you just do the math and pay extra. She was extremely rude and nobody seems to care when people loose their job and are struggling to pay any bills so my water got shut off and that's another \$100 I didn't have and had to borrow money for. The service was just rude and unprofessional

I called to place my account with Water on equal pay. They only allow enrollment once a year. Why? It's so inconvenient. So I have wait until October!

I choose not to answer

I contacted the Mayer regarding continual raising of taxes on the elderly, I got no reply

I contacted the city concerning grafitti. The phone receptionist was very helpful and the response was usually within a day or two.

I contacted the utility department by phone and they were extremely helpful in answering questions for me and helping to set up payment options. I found them to be very professional and pleasant to deal with.

I did request to WJ office to speak with a few residents about trimming trees due to branches were interfering with sidewalk and never saw any actions from either the city or residents.

I feel that code enforcement needs to get on people about there yards

I found it difficult to contact the city - or at least find out whom I need to contact to discuss my issue:

Google Fiber installed in my neighborhood eight months ago. My neighbors have had service for months. Walk 300 feet (cross the street, really), and neither I or my neighbors can get service, even though they installed have fiber at the curb and distributed flyers at our homes when they did the installation. Google claims we are in "unincorporated Salt Lake County" and won't provide service - even though I'm in the city boundary, pay West Jordan Taxes, vote for West Jordan City officials, and have an open West Jordan building permit for my home. My home is even shown in the city map as being in an area where Google Fiber is "done" installing fiber.

I contacted the city in March, and they sent out a couple of guys to take a look, and they verified that I am in the city, and said that Google was still splicing the fiber and we'd be ready in a couple of weeks. Now it's nearly June and nothing has changed.

I'd really like to be able to talk to somebody and find out the truth about why Google isn't providing service, because the excuse they've been giving us is patently false.

I got a call from the city about a potential water leak on our property. When I started looking around to figure out where the leak was I discovered our water heater was leaking. It could have flooded our basement if I hadn't received that call. Thank you!!!

I had a car drive through 2 fences on my property, almost hit my house. After that night, I've had ZERO communication from the police department. I had to pay for all the repairs myself, and have had NO information from the court system. Very unprofessional. I even had to pay to get a police report. Seems like you enjoy punishing victims.



I had an inspector that I really didn't love working with because he was abrupt, rude and had no interest in helping make the situation better. I hated when he came. Then I had another one who [REDACTED] would help with solutions to issues, he had great people skills and he was enjoyable to talk with even if my project failed inspection. I felt heard, understood and had hope moving forward.

I had emailed the Mayor about 1300 W and he responded right away. It was nice to get a response. He also was on my street a week later and knocked on my door and talked to me.

I have a light the is on a road with no vehicle access lighting up a dead end field and my back yard. I would like it deactivated until construction reaches this area, and the city office I called did not know who I should talk to about this issue.

I have a tenant leaving in one of my room in the basement but he have t3 automobile in my house when i requested only one can we call police for a warning?

I have asked for a free soil disposal dumpster to be provided to residents for xeriscaping their yards and have yet to anything t all about it - yes? No? Under consideration? Coming soon?

I have been asking for years, why 90th has not been widened from redwood to bangerter. I avoid traveling on 90th like the plague because it's so congested. Remove the park lane (like they did on redwood) and create a third land in both directions. Why hasn't our council coordinated with the state to get this done? A big 'F' score for this one.....

I have reported a problem with our street curb and gutter area drainage area on the city website and also on the phone. I have gotten no response from anybody. I'm afraid somebody's gonna be walking along there and fall into what is now a small hole.

I have struggled with having my garbage picked up the last few weeks. They have come back out after being contacted, but no one has explained why it keeps happening! I also inquired about why West Jordan doesn't approve air b and b s, but never heard anything back!

I have tried animal control, and wild life removal about trapping and spaying feral cats in my neighborhood, only to be told that nobody can help.

I also rescued some motherless baby ducks and had a very hard time finding anyone who could help. We have a lot of animals out here that need more attention.

I have yet to hear or see the street lights fixed on Black Oak Drive they have been out since beginning of winter and so many kids cross the streets at crosswalks that no longer have functioning lights its dangerous when you are driving and can't see them.

I honestly don't believe my voice matters. I have never heard any one of my West Jordan friends and coworkers say they are happy with the growth in WJ, or the police department

I inquired about a complaint from a neighbor. The office staff was extremely helpful and guided me through the process. They were professional and helpful. I was less than impressed with the Police Force. The officers did ZERO investigation. Charged without evidence or inquiry. And were down right rude and derogatory. The street/beat police officers are not impressive.

I love the public employees. My dealings with the city have been largely positive. I do want the fluoride taken out of our water please.

I never received a response from the transportation manager.

I reported a leak on the city side of my water meter and have no idea if they have come to look at it. The recently fixed a leak on the other side and still on city property and reported that the cap was cracked and they would come replace it. I don't know if that has been taken care of either. It would be nice to have the city report back when they have taken care of these things.

I reported on a house at [REDACTED] that is consistently blocking the sidewalk with vehicles. I haven't heard anything back and the problem continues. The vehicles are parked in so tight that people have to walk out into the street to get by. It's directly in front of a 3 way intersection and I worry about the children walking out into the street on their way to and from school and feel like it's an accident waiting to happen.

I stopped by the gene fullmer rec center to find out about summer a tivities for my 6 year old. The person at the front desk was polite and informed.

I submitted a request from code enforcement to help with issues on a neighbor's lot. I have not received any update. I'm not sure what is going on with the issue.

I thought that my interaction was very positive and appreciated the interaction

I want the green waste pick up back and I love that you have the bins to use for cleanup but by putting the price higher it makes it so we can't afford to do the cleanup and then the neighborhoods dont look as good

I was able to talk with Mayor Burton directly and he even stopped by my house. Unfortunately I was not there, but I appreciate the attention he paid to me.



I was alarmed when a member of the City Council strongly suggested going to the government for financial assistance, rather than suggesting the City exercise more control over City spending.

I was promised by the Mayor to have the City traffic engineer meet with me to discuss traffic calming in my neighborhood. I have yet to hear from anyone from the City on this issue. I was also promised to be sent an application to apply for a position on the Airport board. Again, there was no follow-up. I would like to have been more involved with city committees and boards, but the communication on how to do so seemed lacking.

I was the victim of a violent crime, it has been difficult to get the needed services that I was informed I was entitled to receive. This is an ongoing situation.

I wish to have more control over the dogs barking in my neighborhood. Snow removal on red wood road sidewalks. Atleast on the east side

I would appreciate being able to obtain more relevant and pertinent information about the ownership of homes that are rentals(owners names, contact information, insurance coverage on the rental unit, better code enforcement of rentals, etc).

I would but nothing will change

I would like to see more code enforcement in the neighborhoods with regard to yard and home maintenance.

I feel like the police could do a better job controlling speeders and excessively loud exhaust. (See Idaho's vehicle muffler statute)

I've encountered the Mayor a number of times and have always found him to be affable, engaged, and knowledgeable. I've dealt with two building permits and have found the Building Department people involved to be courteous, responsive, and professional. Code Enforcement is responsive to any filings and appear to have very good follow-through. Park maintenance and snow removal teams are pleasant, efficient, and do great work. Animal shelter staff are always pleasant and easy to work with for licenses, tags, etc.

I've lived here for 6 years and it's becoming unsafe. The neighbors to the North of me are running a very obvious car lot as well as mechanic shop. Lots of scary men every day and cars in front of all neighbors houses. I'm afraid to go outside and take care of my front garden when someone isn't with me! Code enforcement has done nothing to help residents dealing with this!!

I've report the mess and broke down cars on my neighbors yard. Nothing was done. They also have a neglected dog

Inconsistent enforcement of policy and some policies that don't make sense.

Increase traffic east and west by big trucks along Newingham Highway. Lack of a stoplight at the intersection of 6400 W. in Newingham Highway. The delay in opening the 8600 bridge that has been ready for months.

Interested in community market but details are very skimpy.

It was difficult trying to get utilities hooked up for new home

It's a good city. The information I received was helpful and those I contacted were helpful and polite.

I've always had great interactions with city employees. They've always been professional and attentive.

I've contacted code enforcement several times. No one seems to know the codes or willing to enforce them effectively. We have houses with multiple families living within them that at dozens of cars to our streets making it unsafe for our kids and hard to navigate. City has done nothing and when I spoke to one of the leaders they said there was nothing they would do. SJ days something about it and actually a their codes. Hence the stark differences in the the ways the cities appear.

I've had good experiences with the council, communicating about concerns I've already mentioned but also bad experiences, with no response to emails etc. It's frustrating.

LOVE the Passport office. SO much better than going to the post office.

Lately police and they were very helpful

Little preference nor forgetting for

Love Mayor Burton!

Make West Jordan the beautiful place it use to be.

Mark in planning and zoning is amazing. Very knowledgeable and helpful. Wish the police would enforce speed limits. I was going to say better but I'm not sure they do at all.

More skateparks

My biggest beef is the dumpster availability. I reserved the dumpster last year via the website and was willing to pay \$50. However, when I called to check my reservation, they could not find it. I was told the dumpster was no longer available on the date I wanted. I got very



upset. I tried to reserve it this year, the price went up, so forget it!. We pay taxes and had been good citizens. We have not children in school, we cannot even use the the dumpster? Grrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrrr!! I'm really upset!

[REDACTED] was in a car accident and the officer who responded was rude and dismissive. We had a second experience with a police officer and he was the same.

My email was forwarded to a different department then I never heard back from anyone.

My issue is speeding on 2200 W - [REDACTED] has to cross it to walk to school and most drivers are speeding & distracted, cops included.

One controversial piece of action is how traffic is going to be planned around Ron Wood park. The 8600 South bridge is being installed and the communication from the city was to at it would reduce the traffic flow through neighborhoods to get to 5600 West on the west side of Mountain View. However, the route to get to 5600 West did not pass the fronts of any houses even though it was through residential neighborhoods. You would only pass the back or sides of houses on the streets along the routes. In contrast, on Duck Ridge



Way, the proposed plan for park access would needlessly increase traffic through a neighborhood directly in front of people's homes and on a street where children play. I say needlessly because two blocks away is 6400 West where there are no houses facing the street and it is already a north-south main access road. It makes no sense to put the entrance to Ron Wood park on Duck Ridge and to put a traffic light at the end of the street as proposed. The park entrance should be on the busy road (90th south) and the traffic light on the main access road (6400 West). On top of that, the proposed traffic light would force children in one neighborhood to cross 90th South without a traffic light when walking to a school three blocks away. I relayed this in an email to the city council and received no response.

Our drinking water often tastes terrible. So, we contacted the city to ask someone about it. A team came to our house, but basically dismissed our complaints and said the water is fine. We don't drink the water or use it for cooking.

Our neighbor has a reception center in their backyard and no parking. People frequently park in front of the stop sign and right at the end of the street creating a hazard trying to get out of the neighborhood. When we call the non-emergency police line no one comes out and when they do come out the cars are not ticketed. It's really annoying and dangerous.

Our police force is probably understaffed, but the amount of traffic violations I see on a DAILY basis is growing and getting very concerning. Speeding, running red lights, tailgating, etc.

Our water bills are extremely ridiculous especially for those of us that take care of our yards, we need more open space and less high density housing, more restaurants are needed. It feels like businesses would rather be in south Jordan instead.

Over the past year, I haven't had much contact with the City.

Parking enforcement

Passport office: some staff friendly and professional, others not so much

People are great, would prefer a light but we got keep clear. It's helped some.

Please clean up the city. Especially on 1300 W and just S of 7000 South. I realize there are low income areas there but they should have to maintain their properties. One is a trailer that has had additions and is literally missing a wall. [REDACTED] It is a total disgrace.

Please force them to clean it up.

Please keep utilities in check that over spending does not happen. It's expensive to live in West Jordan and we don't want to move thanks

Please widen roads to reduce traffic.

Police Department

Police are overstressed. They are excellent but not able to keep up with the growth rate.

Police department and fire department have been particularly responsive to a couple of wellness calls. Police administrative staff were also excellent when I visited in person.

Police department detectives are not good with following up and calling me back.

Police force interactions disrespectful, code enforcement methodology a joke. The city should help people to meet code by offering taxpayer services to meet the violations of tree trimming and other cost-prohibitive and labor-prohibitive mandates.

Recycling costs too much

Reported graffiti in my neighborhood park and within a day it was taken care of.

Road construction. 1300 west between 7800 s and 90th south has had construction for years now, and still keeps getting closed. Maybe an investigation as to why? Are those doing the construction have a relative in West Jordan city? Very unacceptable in my opinion.

[REDACTED] laughed at me on the phone while I was very upset regarding the Google Fiber construction around my house. He told the SCI contractor for Google Fiber that this was his City and he makes the decision and to lay the Fiber around my house even when Google and SCI would have done a stop work or DB. I am very disappointed with [REDACTED].

Shared message about profanity and graffiti at community park, but didn't receive a reply, so don't know if it was received

Sidewalk, streets, and gutter department have been very rude when responding to my issues at [REDACTED] they've told me multiple times for 3 years now that they'll be coming to my house to discuss a solution but never show up. GETTING EXTREMELY Frustrating

Sidewalks in residential areas are mostly in poor conditions for older neighborhoods. Like sidewalk lifting and cement crumbling.

Sometimes need big containers for big trashes

Started a case to have offensive graffiti removed from a fence that faces the houses in our neighborhood. I was told it would be taken care of. A year later nothing was done. I responded again and was told it was taken care of, when it was not. Was once again told it would be taken care of. 3 months later nothing has been done



Still a little frustrated about the construction company that put in the fiber pedestals. Other neighbors had theirs buried under the ground and we have ugly ones on the surface. It seems like there should be some kind of law against that.

Stormwater drain near my house are causing flooding near my house. West Jordan city said they would fix it this year but nothing has happened yet.

Street lighting. The city responded rather quickly.

Talked to parks and recs about the west jordan cemetery. The person that contacted me was very professional. Nothing changed at the cemetery with being consistent with the rules and up keep.

Thanks for having the electronic recycling/throw away events regularly.

Thanks for the gas line utilities markings in our yard. Wondering why it had to be spray painted with a permanent yellow on the newly refinished asphalt? Perhaps, the city needs a talk with the utility companies and ask them use less permanent and tasteless methods of markings.

The Police department lacks many things.

They are not well trained, have very big egos. They are lazy and they like to arrest people for no good cause. They will lie and manipulate as much as they can in hopes that you do not to defend yourself. They shut off body camera recordings when the talk amongst their selves to collaborate their stories. And the caption is a very lazy person that helps them come up for reasons to arrest people when they have no nothing else to go on, hoping you'll just go to court pay your fine, and not defend yourself. In short I'm very disappointed in the police department.

The abusive code enforcement department continues to prefer to participate in feuds between neighbors. This extremely toxic and aggressive department creates ugly conflicts with people over petty things. Similar to the virtually unaccountable and overly large police department. Police seem to be everywhere and their focus seems to be writing tickets to generate revenue.

The biggest eyesore the city has right now is the CenturyLink implementation. They have ruined yards among other things. They "planted" new sod in my yard that ended up being completely brown. I had to spend my own money to water and try to get it to grow. Extremely dissatisfied with them being allowed to tear up my yard.

The building permit approval process is cumbersome and a challenge to navigate. The interface between the Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District and the City planning department is broken.

The city doesn't respond in a timely manner via social media about safety issues - water flooding the road, cars parked in bike lanes on 78th South

The city fails to take action when malfunctioning equipment is reported. Many sections of the sidewalk are dangerous due to either raised sections or colaps. Road maintenance and snow removal have steadily improved.

The code enforcement officer is a jerk

The code enforcement team passed the buck to the county. They passed it back. In the end, issues were observed once and nothing was done to fix the issues because code enforcement has no real authority.

The customer service from the city offices has been fantastic, particularly if there has been an issue with a utility bill

The office staff is very Accommodating, The street department when I have issues are right one it. There's to people and way to much traffic.

The passport office personnel were courteous and professional.

The permit office is always friendly

The person on the phone was very helpful and answered my question.

The police department was extremely helpful.

The police driving trucks in this day and age when fuel expenses high, is irresponsible.

Garbage days are often missed, even when cans are placed out the night before.

It's really disappointing that they waited over 10 years to update the infrastructure, with all the growth on the west end of the city.

The police, code enforcement, and animal services seem to pander to violators which encourages more bad behavior. While it may keep the violators happy it provides a disservice to those who follow the rules and are have our lives disrupted by the violators. The city does not enforce basic laws and codes and it shows in the decay of our neighbors.



The sidewalk on my street has buckeled up d/t the overgrowing root system. I worry someone is going to trip when they walk there. Also my street has a street light on one end which is surrounded by bushy trees, and provides no light or protection to homeowners. It is placed at the end of the block covered with trees. The rest of the street, 90% has no street light and I'm afraid to go out at night.

The sidewalk repair service seems to be non-existent and there is no response from the department.

The temporary office for utilities was difficult to navigate and inconvenient.

The traffic going east and west is discouraging

The water department came out and fixed a leak at the neighborhood park very promptly, a hydrant hadn't been completely shut off. I received feedback that I hadn't expected to receive, it was nice.

The water department is awesome - called me about a leak that developed while I was out of town

The west jordan employee who turned our water off and back on for us was so kind and happy to help us several times when we had a leak inside our house this past year. Thank you! Thank you! A thousand times thank you!

There are a lot of irresponsible dog owners in my neighborhood that let their dogs bark all day. My neighbor directly next to me was particularly bad. Contacting animal services helped to stress the issue. After speaking with my neighbor, the issue improved but now my neighbor hates me. Haha.

There are not enough highways currently between us and the main highways. With as much growth as we are experiencing, we need to either create more highways or to stop the growth in population.

There is a semi-truck contently parked in the street at [REDACTED], many calls/walk-ins to the police, Repeat offender.

There was graffiti on my mailbox. Reporting the incident was easy and it was quickly fixed.

I called the police (I can't remember if it was 911 or dispatch) about a man banging on the door across the street, when no one responded, he grabbed a rock from their garden and used it to bang on the door, eventually throwing the rock at the door. 20 minutes later the police hadn't arrived, and my neighbor returned, and everything appeared to be fine. I called dispatch and let them know they were no longer needed. I haven't been feeling as safe as I used to and the police not responding within 20 minutes of my call has made me feel pretty unsafe.

They seem very bothered when you call for any reason usually only utility people they have been very short and rude before but has got a little better

Things are honestly pretty good. I'd like some sidewalks and streets worked on. There's also some street lights that don't work and it seems pretty dark. Perhaps more would even be good near me. Somehow keep some parked cars off the street. I don't have many complaints now as the incidences of crime and vandalism I have witness have gone down.

To many barking dogs

Unbridled Hope and Healing is located near Ronwood Park and is a huge asset to the WJ community, the city is saying it's zoned wrong and not extending their lease. This would be a huge loss for WJ and the community they serve

Very dissatisfied, nobody bother to contact me back about my issue on my street.

Very good passport services. Very friendly, helpful, and fast

Very possible

Was told code enforcement would handle, but the problem still exist. Have provided Photos of campers without roofs, trucks that haven't moved in 4 years.

Water pressure is sporadic, errors on billing, road rage is out of control and little enforcement of ticketing drivers, road maintenance is constant and lacking in quality.

We had a city light that was out as you are just entering our neighborhood from a busy street. I reported it on the city website and it was fixed within a few days. Much appreciated!

We had a garbage can that was missing a lid and they came out within a few days and replaced it. Very fast and very professional.

We had a need of a neighborhood street light in a dark area, the Mayor came out and met with us and we received the street light needed.

We had a water leak under the pavement on our street. They came out and looked at it and said they would fix it as soon as they could. It was fixed in less than a week.

We had an inspection on our basement to be finished called a four-way inspection. There were a few items that needed to be corrected by the contractor, but mostly he said it passed. When it came time for the final inspection, we were told the plumbing was done wrong and that it shouldn't have passed the four-way inspection. So now we are out quite a bit of money and still don't have it finished. I feel like



the for the four-way inspection a little bit to blame for this. We could've had it fixed to begin with but now the Contractor is long gone so that is pretty frustrating . The second inspection was more thorough, but we still have not passed inspection because we have to get the plumbing fixed. So it's been an expensive ordeal. It probably could've been prevented.

We had neighbor dogs escape and tried for hours to catch them. I don't remember her name from animal control but she came back 3 times that day determined to get them back home, which we finally did

We have reached out to code enforcement several times because of the parking situation in our neighborhood. Nothing has changed.

We rented a dumpster this spring and I had to email the city for information and the representative was very helpful

We would like to suggest a more stable property tax rate for seniors. We are being taxed out of our home!

West Jordan is the only city where we have missed having our garbage picked up (twice, years apart).

Oth times I confirmed on the website that it should have been a pick up day, and then called to ask why are trash and not been picked up. And they had to send someone back out. Just interesting, never had it happen anywhere else.

West jordan city water services. Had a problem with water main and they said it needed a valve and was never replaced or taken care of.

When I and my family first moved to West Jordan there were only 6000 residents. So using the many changes taking place here been mostly satisfied with those changes.

When I get a ticket for parking on my own dirt spot and my taxes go to pay for the roads to get fixed and they don't get fixed in my front yard for days and days even months and then they fill it in with asphalt, which is gravel and they only fill two of the holes, not all of them Get spit out and spread all over the road into the neighbors yards so I get a ticket but on the roads if a rock hits my car or if I get a flat tire from a pothole, you guys don't fix it and then I have to complain about the roads again I park in my dirt and we get tickets

When we call the police to come, we expect them to come. Eventually the idiots that speed up and down the street on their dirt bikes, are going to hurt someone.

When we called code enforcement they told us the codes on the website are not up to date. When we ask if someone could tell us what the codes were they said no. Is there anyone that drives around anymore to look at neighborhoods? When we first moved in we had someone driving around all the time. Not we have people parking motorhomes in the front yard, parking semi trucks on the street and trailers for days with no violations being given.

Currently many of the residence around me drive 20 minutes to the Kearns Rec Center.
