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23 **1-7-5: DISCRETIONARY AUTHORITY OF THE MAYOR:**

24 The mayor may, as allowed by law:

25 A. Subject to budget constraints and subsections 1-8-1B and 1-8-1C, create any other  
26 administrative office that the mayor considers necessary for good government of the city and  
27 appoint a person to the office.

28 B. Dismiss or remove any person appointed by the mayor, without the council's advice and  
29 consent, but shall notify the council as soon as reasonably possible, but no later than two (2)  
30 business days after the dismissal or removal.

31 C. Veto an ordinance, tax levy, or appropriation passed by the council,~~consistent with Utah~~  
32 ~~Code section 10-3b-204.~~

33 D. Exercise control of and supervise,~~through the city administrator,~~ each executive branch  
34 department, division, or office of the city.

35 E. ~~Within the general provisions of statute and ordinance, and through the city administrator,~~  
36 ~~Regulate and prescribe the powers and duties of each other executive~~ branch or administrative  
37 ~~officer or employee of the city.~~

38 F. ~~Subject to state statute and council rules,~~ A attend each council meeting, take part in council  
39 meeting discussions, and give advice to the council.

40 G. Appoint a budget officer to serve in place of the mayor to comply with and fulfill in all  
41 other respects the requirements of chapter 6, Uniform Fiscal Procedures Act for Utah Cities.

42 H. Execute an agreement on behalf of the city, or delegate, by written executive order, the  
43 authority to execute an agreement on behalf of the city:

44 1. If the obligation under the agreement is within certified budget appropriations; and

45 2. Subject to section Utah Code section 10-6-138.

46 I. At any reasonable time, examine and inspect the official books, papers, records, or  
47 documents of:

48 1. The city; or

49 2. Any officer, employee, or agent of the city.

50 J. Remit all fines and forfeitures.~~Ensure that all fines and forfeitures are processed properly.~~

51 K. If necessary, ~~and consistent with section 1-7-7,~~ call on residents of the city over the age of  
52 21 years to assist in enforcing the laws of the state and ordinances of the city.

53 L. Release a person imprisoned for a violation of a city ordinance,~~if specifically authorized~~  
54 ~~by law to do so.~~

55 M. Prescribe rules and regulations,~~not inconsistent with this code, council policy, other law,~~  
56 to ensure efficiency and effectiveness in the operations of city government. (Ord. 19-37, 11-13-

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59 **1-7-6: LIMITATIONS OF AUTHORITY OF THE MAYOR:**

60 The mayor may not:

61 A. Vote on any matter before the council.

62 B. Enter into an employment contract that contains an automatic renewal provision with the  
63 city administrator.

64 C. Waive any ~~fin~~~~es and~~ fees, unless specifically authorized by law to do so. (Ord. 19-37, 11-
